Board Chair Campbell opened the Board meeting at 4:00 pm.

OATH OF OFFICE

The attending newly elected Directors (Directors Hamann, Hillers, Niedermeyer, and Rice) took the oath of office and signed the oath document. Directors Dean and Wright will take the oath of office at the February Board Meeting.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

A motion by Director Niedermeyer asked that the secretary cast a unanimously ballot for the current slate of officers which are Chair, Allan Campbell; Vice Chair, Barbara Niedermeyer; Secretary/Treasurer, Ron Hillers. The motion passed unanimously.

AGENDA

Paul DeMaggio & Clint Nichols will give the presentation on the Abbey Lane Project at the next Board Meeting. District Manager White does not have enough information on employee retirement options at this time. He should have more details by the next Board meeting.

MINUTES

A motion by Director Rice with a second by Director Niedermeyer to approve the minutes from the December 7, 2016 Board Meeting passed unanimously.

TREASURER REPORTS

A motion by Director Hillers with a second by Director Niedermeyer to accept the December Treasurer Reports as presented passed unanimously.

STAFF SUCCESS STORIES

Kora reported that since starting at JSWCD, the City of Talent's riparian project has been completed. There are more projects initially started by the previous Urban Planner and Kora is working closely with the clients as they complete their projects.

Jackson SWCD prohibits discrimination in its programs on the basis of race, color, national origin, gender, religion, age, disability, Political beliefs, sexual orientation, and marital or familial status. Jen reported that the Annual Celebration is still in the planning stages but it will be sometime in February or March. As soon as a venue is secured she will e-mail the Board with the details.

At 5 pm staff was excused.

CORRESPONDENCE

District Manager White pointed out that the National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD) newsletter included the letter that they signed along with other agriculture groups addressed to President-elect Trump. This letter was in response to the monument proclamation enacted by President Obama and the need for Congress to revise and limit the Antiquities Act. Jackson County has a Land Use Plan and went on record against the monument. Government entities such as JSWCD can request a "seat at the table" when proposals like the monument arise, if JSWCD has a Land Use Plan. A discussion followed and Director Niedermeyer suggested that the District Manager put together a summary on what would be needed for the District to adopt a Land Use Plan. It was suggested that he look at the County's Land Use Plan to see if some of their plan could be used for the District Plan. The Board concurred.

District Manager White also shared the Director Training announcement from the Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA). Director Dean will attend this workshop.

STRATEGIC PLAN

A motion by Director Niedermeyer with a second by Director Rice to accept the current Vision and Mission Statements in the Strategic Plan, as stated passed unanimously.

For the next Board Meeting, the Directors should bring any edits on the body of the Strategic Plan. The changes to the strategic plan are far enough along for Staff to start their bi-annual plans now.

NRCS

Peter Winnick, Soil Conservationist for NRCS, reported that they are continuing to take applications for all of their programs. They are also working on new conservation strategies.

OREGON WATERSHED ENHANCEMENT BOARD (OWEB) SMALL GRANTS

Director Niedermeyer reported that the OWEB Small Grant Team met on January 12, 2017 to review the five applications submitted. Four applications were funded but because there were not enough funds available, the fifth applicant was asked to resubmit. The next application window is from April 16 through April 30, 2017. Only \$413.00 remain of the \$100,000 allocated for this area.

SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION (SWCC)

District Manager White reported that Director Dean will be attending the SWCC meeting as well the Curry County SWCD Board Meeting – both meetings are in February.

There was no public comment.
